## Dear Parents/Carers

I hope you and all our students have had a restful festive season and that you managed to spend quality time together as a family. I also want to wish you a happy and prosperous year ahead.

This term is a remarkably busy one. Year 8s start their formal assessment this week and 9s will have their formal assessments before the Easter holidays. Both of these will take place in the exam hall. Our Year 11s will have their second set of mock exams at the start of the next half-term. Year 8s will also take part in the Options process. In addition, we will see the return of our school musical – this year The Addams Family which will take place toward the end of the spring term. Students involved have been working hard rehearsing since the beginning of the Academic Year. If the Christmas music and dance show was anything to go by, it will be a huge success.
